
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TSI: Timeline





TSI: Where do we stand

- Four key features of the assistance we have been providing:
 - Skills Training: CompNet (done), MDI (done, collecting feedback)
 - Improve microdata infrastructure and access (CompNet, and MDI)
 - Develop NSIs and NPBs networks to strengthen knowledge sharing and best practices (Microsoft Teams platform launched February 2024)
 - Setting and pursuing a common research agenda
 - Year 1: CompNet and MDI Data Development
 - Provided skills training and data access for CompNet to NPBs while making progress on MDI microdata development with NSIs.
 - Developed common research agenda (1st and 2nd TSI Workshops in Lisbon and Halle)
 - Produced Firms Productivity report
- Year 2: MDI Development, Training, and Research
 - Continued data infrastructure development (with country data implementation and MDI Launches)
 - MDI training workshop held on 18th-19th Nov 2024, development of networking platform (Teams)
 - MDI applications for policy research (presented in two poster sessions in June and September) and
 -To be finalised in a report to be presented at the Berlin TSI conference in March 2025

Year 2 of TSI: MDI 2.1 Test Launch

- Objectives of this launch:
 - Test the MDI new infrastructure in each country (NL, FR, SI, PT, FI)
 - Run the same batch of codes across countries to get comparable results for various topics in the research agenda
 - Extract relevant statistics to better understand the data availability in each country
- Commenced on 19 January 2024
- First round of results were presented at the 3rd TSI Workshop in Vienna on 22-23
 February, and in two Poster Sessions of high level conferences in June and September 2024

Research themes

- Four research themes were investigated. The preliminary results presented at the Workshop in Vienna and in two Poster sessions in Conferences in June and September 2024. They fostered ongoing active <u>collaboration with</u> national NPBs:
 - Monetary Policy (<u>FR</u>)
 - Trade and Competitiveness (SI)
 - Firm Dynamics (SI)
 - Energy (SI, FR, DE, AT)

Launch 2.1 Preliminary Results

- Monetary Policy (leader: Daniele Aglio)
 - estimates the influence of productivity distribution on the slope of the Phillips curve
 - How Phillips curve change according to productivity distribution?
 - How less liquid firms (with lower markup) respond to monetary policy in terms of cash holdings?
 - Corporate savings and macro unbalances.
 - Ongoing collaboration of France Stratégie.
- Trade and Competitiveness (Leader: Ashim Dubey/formerly Marco Matani)
 - Investigates the mechanisms through which productivity diffuses within Global Value Chains (GVC)
 - How does productivity transfer within Global Value Chains (GVC), i.e., from the most productive firms in partner countries tonational firms?
 - Do firms that are trailing in terms of productivity experience an advantage in terms of productivity transmission (catching ψ) or a disadvantage (falling further behind)?
 - Is the diffusion process smoother for the most productive (frontier) national firms?
 - Do productivity gains spread more quickly within multinational groups? Has Brexit posed challenges to GVC relations with the UK?
 - Ongoing collaboration with IMAD (Slovenia) and the National Bank of Slovakia.

Launch 2.1 Preliminary Results

- Firm Responsiveness (Leader: Chengzi Yi/formerly Leonardo Indraccolo)
 - provides novel insights on how measures of firm responsiveness change over the business cycle and across countries.
 - Study responses both in terms of labor and capital adjustment.
 - Their contribution is to separate firm responsiveness into an extensive and intensive margin component and highlight which margin matters most over the business cycle.
 - Counter parties from IMAD (Slovenia) expressed high interest in the project applied to Slovenia, which will be employed as soon as data will be ready.
- Energy (Marcelo Piemonte)
 - Studies the mechanisms through which energy efficiency is met, such as cleansing effects, productivity gains, innovation, trade, and other potential avenues.
 - The project started as joint with German and French NPBs, focusing on the comparison of stylized facts from the two
 countries.
 - After the 3rd TSI Workshop in Vienna, interest has been shown by IMAD (Slovenia) and Austrian NPBs.
 - Collaboration is also ongoing with an OECD team.

Next Steps

- Finalize basic trainings (November 18/19-25)
- Finalize infrastructure
 - Germany, Slovenia, Austria, Portugal
- Consolidate research output: Productivity report
 - including output from research lines and CompNet
- Final TSI Conference Berlin: Hosted by DE-NBP-SVR
- Beyond TSI (after April 2025):
 - Operationalize access modes with NSI: TSI.2 for NPB?
 - Additional (in-depth) trainings on specific topics
 - Develop a proposal submission and development platform
 - Expand network of NSI and NPB
 - Expand MDI to other countries (UK, Italy, Spain...)
